### Checklist

- Valid passport/ID card: If you need a visa, apply for it well in advance
- Prescriptions (optical and general); extra medication (recommended)
- Credit card (MasterCard/VISA), debit card (Maestro/EC)
- ISIC card (recommended, [www.isic.de](http://www.isic.de))
- Munich travel guide book, some warm clothes and sturdy shoes
- Toiletry brands may differ from those in your home country, so you may want to bring your own
- Please bring your own towels, as they will not be provided for you. Bed linen, sheets, blankets and kitchen utensils will be provided
- Photocopies of your passport and other important documents: Never carry your original passport with you unless you are travelling
- Keep copies of your credit card numbers and phone numbers in order to cancel cards in case they get lost or stolen. Keep this information separate from your wallet

## Travel to the Programme (June 30<sup>th</sup> – September 8<sup>th</sup> and onwards)

You will need to organize your own travel to and from the programme. You should plan to arrive at the Munich Airport no later than [1:00 p.m. on Friday, June 30<sup>th</sup>](#).

We will refund travel expenses to and from the programme up to € 350. All travel expenses will only be refunded with submission of **original receipts (proof of payment) and boarding passes**. Finalize all travel arrangements before coming to Munich, as we must receive all travel receipts by the second week of the programme. **Please send us your travel information** (dates of travel, depart/arrival time, airline information) via email ([amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de](mailto:amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de)) as soon as you have booked your trips.

You are welcome to arrange travel either earlier or later than the programme, but you will definitely have to find your own housing if you arrive earlier. Student dorm rooms are available **upon request** until September 28<sup>th</sup>, 10:00 a.m.

Note:

Since the programme ends with the Cambridge Symposium (September 2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>), your return ticket home (except for scholars remaining in the UK) should be after we come back to Munich, so please plan to depart from Munich on September 7<sup>th</sup> and onwards. The official end of the programme is September 8<sup>th</sup>.

Please inform us of any deviating travel arrangement you may make in advance.

**Keep all invoices (and proof of payment), train tickets, boarding passes, and other travel receipts for reimbursement of travel costs!**

## How to get to the University on June 30<sup>th</sup> 2017

### Arrival by airplane:

Please take the S-Bahn (S8 or S1) from the airport, which departs every 10 minutes. You will have to buy a ticket (either at a machine or the S-Bahn help desk), and be sure to stamp it before boarding. Get off at "Marienplatz" and change to subway U6 in direction of "Garching Forschungszentrum" or U3 in direction of "Moosach". Get off at the station "Universität".

Fare: € 11.20 (single ticket, 4 zones)

### Arrival by train:

Please take the S-Bahn from the main train station ("Hauptbahnhof") to the station "Marienplatz" (many train choices). From there take the subway U6 in direction of "Garching Forschungszentrum" or U3 in direction of "Moosach". Get off at the station "Universität".

Fare: € 2.80 (single ticket, 1 zone)

### Arrival by bus at ZOB (Central bus station):

At the central bus station (ZOB) you can take any "S-Bahn" in direction of "Hauptbahnhof". Get off at "Marienplatz" and change to subway U6 in direction of "Garching Forschungszentrum" or U3 in direction of "Moosach". Get off at the station "Universität".

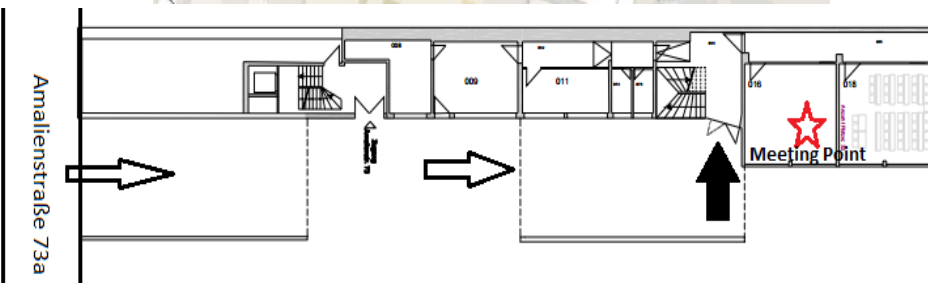
## Welcome Reception

## Opening Retreat

During the Welcome Reception, the programme coordinators will greet all students. At 4:30 p.m. the bus will leave Munich for the Opening Retreat (June 30<sup>th</sup> to July 3<sup>rd</sup>), organised south of the city in Spitzingsee at the Alte Wurzhütte ([www.alte-wurzhuette.de](http://www.alte-wurzhuette.de)).

**Departure:** Friday, June 30<sup>th</sup>, 4:30 p.m.

The schedule for the Opening Retreat will be sent by email in June.

On July 3<sup>rd</sup> we will return to Munich. Before the return trip from Alte Wurzhütte, our staff will distribute public transportation tickets for Munich, the University Mensa (cafeteria) Card, and the first rate of the scholarship in cash, which is about € 300. You will also receive a programme tote including programme information, a map of Munich, city information, as well as a map of Munich's public transportation system (MVG).

Once in Munich, the bus will take you directly to your accommodation, where you may check-in and drop off your luggage in your room. Afterwards, you can take advantage of your free time for lunch etc. before the city tour.

### Scholar research project presentations (weekly, July 12<sup>th</sup> to Aug. 23<sup>th</sup>)

Scholars will meet once a week to discuss their research projects with one another. In these sessions, groups of 4 scholars will give a short (10 min.) presentation on their research project hypothesis (-ses), methods/techniques utilized, and current challenges faced. Each presentation will be followed by a short Q&A. Sessions will be catered with a light dinner. We highly recommend you to invite your mentors/tutors and lab colleagues to these sessions, and only ask that they RSVP to [amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de](mailto:amgenscholars@bio.lmu.de) at least 2 days beforehand.

### Academic Workshops

Scholars participate in several workshops: Scientific Writing, Presentation Skills, Poster Design and Presentation, and How to Apply for a Graduate Position.

Scholars will tour the high-tech laboratories of the Amgen Research Munich GmbH to gain insight in the Biotech industry.

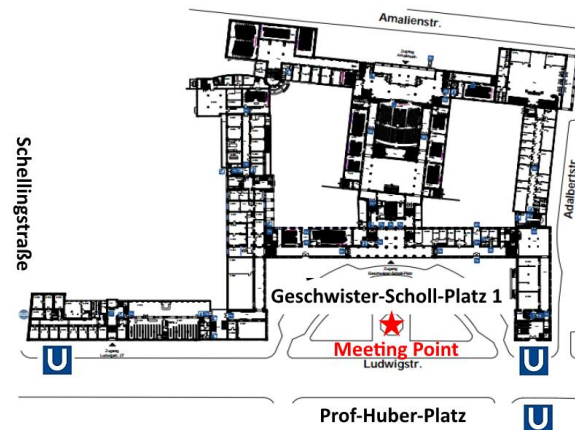
### Munich Poster Symposium (September 1<sup>st</sup>)

Travel to and from the symposium will be arranged by the programme. Individual scholars are responsible for obtaining proper UK travel visas if necessary. The costs for the bus and entrance ticket for the castle are covered by the programme. You are responsible for your food and beverages. Always bring weather-proof clothing and proper shoes with you. Since we will be travelling by bus, you can always leave personal belongings in the bus.

## Accommodation

Due to the extremely tight housing situation in Munich, in July, students will be accommodated in two different locations in Munich: in the city centre and in Studentenstadt. The housing facilities are located close to bus or subway stations with a good connection to the university and laboratories, respectively.

In August and September all students will stay in apartments in Studentenstadt, close to the subway station "Studentenstadt" (Subway U6).

Here students will live in apartments equipped with a bathroom and a kitchen where you can prepare meals. You will be provided with a plate, a cup, a bowl, a pan, and one set of silverware as well as bedding (sheets and blankets), which can be cleaned at one of the several laundry facilities close to the apartments. **Towels will not be provided.** We kindly ask you to acquire them according to your own personal needs. **Kitchen utensils will be provided.**

Please note that student apartments are geared towards student needs and financial means. As such, please do not expect apartments to meet claims on luxury comfort.

In Munich, tap water is drinkable and is of very good drinking quality.

Recycling is highly encouraged in Germany and therefore glass and plastic bottles, as well as metal cans come with a deposit (called "Pfand") that you can get back by returning the bottles/cans.



It is not allowed to pass the room to someone else or to sub-let it.

### Note: Dorm check-out

Students are expected to leave their rooms in a clean condition, and remember to return the key to their dorm supervisor. More information regarding dorm check-out will be provided in Munich.

### Keys

Each student will receive one key/a set of keys for his apartment. Never leave your room without a key, because the door shuts easily. If you lose the key, it will cost you approx. € 120. During the day you can call the caretaker of the dorms. Between the hours of 4 p.m. and 7 a.m., you will have to call the locksmith and you will be charged approx. € 140!

### Tip:

Should this happen to you, you might stay in a friend's or classmate's room and ask the janitor to assist you the following morning.

## Electricity

In Germany, electronic devices run at 220 – 230V with a frequency of 50 Hz. Please make sure that your plugs fit a type C or type F socket, or consider purchasing an electronic adapter before your arrival.



## Monthly Transportation Pass

Monthly transportation passes for the duration of the programme will be provided to you as part of the benefits. In addition to the Mensa Card and your room key, the transportation passes will be handed out before the return trip to Munich after the Opening Retreat. Please note that you are required to have your IsarCard on you at all times when using the subway system; if you are caught without your card, then you will be required to personally pay the € 60 fine. Furthermore, you will be required to personally pay for replacement of a lost IsarCard.

## Insurance

Health, Liability and Accident Insurance is provided by the programme. You have already received an electronic copy of your policy. You will receive a printed copy of the original policy after your arrival in Munich, as you will need a copy of this whenever you should visit a doctor.

**Note:** The insurance is valid from June 30<sup>th</sup> until September 8<sup>th</sup>. If you plan to stay longer, please make sure to extend your insurance.

## Phone

**Call Shops:** Probably the cheapest way to make phone calls is using the Call Shops at the main train station "Hauptbahnhof".

**Cell Phones:** Of course, you can also check with your current cell phone provider if it is financially feasible to change your current contract accordingly.

**Prepaid Cards:** You might also consider purchasing a SIM-card which has a German number and costs approx. € 10.00 to charge. You can use them with your own cell phone. Such cards can be bought at supermarkets and will make it easier for you to communicate with each other.

**Please note:** Most of the SIM-cards are not automatically micro SIM-cards (you need them for iPhone, e.g.)

## Internet at the Student Residence



All rooms in the student residence are equipped for internet access by Ethernet cable. Please bring your own Ethernet cable with you to be able to get internet access. Your working place will also have internet access; details will be provided by your labs here in Munich.

### You can eduroam in munich!



**eduroam** (education roaming) is an international roaming service for users in research and higher education. It provides researchers, teachers and students easy and secure network access when visiting another institution.

Each student will receive the Eduroam login information on the day of their arrival to access the LMU-Wifi. You do not have to pay for using eduroam.

## Mensa Card

In the cafeterias managed by the Student Union or “Studentenwerk” (such as the BioCenter, on Schillerstraße or Goethestraße) you will have to pay with a “Mensa Card” (i.e. Cafeteria Card), a chip-based electronic purchase system.

For the Max-Planck-Institute cafeterias, you will need to pay cash.

You will receive a Mensa Card that already has a € 5.00 credit for your first meal and a € 7.00 security deposit. The security deposit will be refunded to you, alongside any remaining credit, upon return of the card at the end of your stay in one of the cafeterias. More credit may be put on cards at certain loading terminals (called “Aufwerter”) at the entrance area of each cafeteria (operating with bills and credit cards).

The Mensa Card, with a purchase credit of € 5.00, will be handed out during the Opening Retreat.

## Sports Activities

In Munich the sport locations of the university are restricted to long-term students of the LMU. We can recommend you some possibilities open to the public.

**Outdoor activities:** Munich has a lot of large parks, such as the English Garden, the Olympic Park or the Luitpold Park. These green areas are great for jogging, playing soccer or other outdoor activities.

**Biking:** Munich is an excellent city for biking. Bikes can be rented for day trips (Radverleih i. Hbf., Hauptbahnhof) or at any time when using services such as "MVG Rad". You can find out more info regarding biking in Munich here: [www.muenchen.de/int/en/traffic/biking.html](http://www.muenchen.de/int/en/traffic/biking.html)

**Swimming:** There are a variety of excellent public swimming halls and outdoor pools all around Munich, for example the Olympic Swimming Hall (Coubertinplatz 1). The regular entrance fee is 4.70 € for 3 hours. For an economic alternative, entrance fees are reduced for early (before 10:30 a.m.) and late swimmers (after 8:30 p.m.). **Sauna:** The swimming halls are usually combined with a sauna facility. The regular entrance fee for the sauna (access to swimming pool included) at the Olympic Centre (Coubertinplatz 1) is € 18 for 4 hours. After 8:00 p.m. the entrance is reduced to € 12.50. **Tennis:** One possibility to play tennis is at the courts of Olympic Centre (Spiridon-Louis-Ring 21), where tennis rackets may be rented. The prices vary between € 9.50 and € 17.00 depending on the time of day and which day of the week. You should make a reservation beforehand by calling 089/30 67 - 2689: [www.olympiapark.de/en/sport-leisure/outdoor/tennis](http://www.olympiapark.de/en/sport-leisure/outdoor/tennis)

**Gym:** For most gyms, a membership of several months is required. Some centres offer tickets in packets of ten, which can be shared by several students. Information can be found here: [www.mcfit.com/de/](http://www.mcfit.com/de/)

## Shopping Facilities

### Opening hours / General

Opening hours are usually 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m., although smaller shops, such as bakeries, often close earlier. **Please note that all shops and supermarkets are closed on Sundays and holidays (e.g. 15<sup>th</sup> August),** with the exception of some shops at the central train station ("Hauptbahnhof") or gas stations. Some bakeries are open on Sunday before mid-day.

### Shopping Malls

The best option for shopping is the pedestrian zone in the city center between Marienplatz and Karlsplatz. Munich has some shopping malls outside of the city center, such as the "Olympia-Einkaufszentrum" (U3 > Olympia-Einkaufszentrum; [www.olympia-einkaufszentrum.de](http://www.olympia-einkaufszentrum.de)), "Riem Arcaden" (U2 > Messestadt-West; [riemarcaden.de](http://riemarcaden.de)), Einkaufs-Center Neuperlach - pep (U5 > Neuperlach Zentrum; [www.einkaufscenter-neuperlach.de](http://www.einkaufscenter-neuperlach.de)), "PasingArcaden" (S-bahn > Pasing; [www.pasing-arcaden.de](http://www.pasing-arcaden.de)).
